My Grandfather's First Family Digging up the past - By Donna Lea Gear Loper

It started with my **Aunt Mary**. She said that her father had 2 children by his 1st wife, whose names were **Bruce** & **Helen**. She was reluctant to talk about her father and it took years to break through in my research with clues to answer nagging questions about my grandfather Gear. Researching **William Hathaway Gear's** 1st family took hours, but ultimately brought me together with his granddaughter, **Janet Lynn Lockhart**.

I checked census records of this 1st family, and found Laura, Viola & Lillian together with their mother, but could not imagine what happened to the 2 oldest children—Bruce & Helen. I later learned that they were raised by their maternal Grandmother Caroline "Libbie" Oakes, who m. 1) William E. Cobley & 2) John Willard Decker. Historical newspapers held one snippet that Lillian (Gear) Lockhart was survived by 2 children—Janet and Jon Lockhart. I used

the *DexKnows* search tools to find **Janet Lockhart** in the Dallas, TX area and took a chance and made the call.

It was tricky—how dare a descendant of the *other woman* [the 2nd wife, 20 yrs. younger!] call after the family had fallen apart. On voice mail, I explained that I was the granddau. of **Wm. Hathaway Gear**, doing family research. I hoped this message was being received by **Janet Lockhart**, dau/o **Lillian Blanche Gear**. Suddenly the phone picks up and drops to the floor—rattling in my ear. My heart starts pounding..."Who did you say your name was?" a voice asks.

I respond with my name and she interrupts me to say, "Do you know how long I have been looking for you?" All I could think to say was "Does this mean this is a good thing?" "Oh yes!"

Janet exclaimed.

Janet and I became fast friends. She had so many questions! Family legend had made the "other" family out to be evil, yet here I was, as open and curious about her and her family as she was about mine. She said we were all just "normal folk after all."

It was an honor to work with her sifting through myths & murk to piece together the fabric of our families. For 2 yrs. we worked together cross-checking our findings. She would hunt through the garage boxes, & I would crawl online databases & scanned records to bring it together. In June 2009



Janet was diagnosed with a brain tumor that took her life on 10 July '09. She was in hospice care when she asked to call me. Janet couldn't hold the phone, but through the speaker she could hear my excitement to talk to her, comfort her, & thank her for the treasures we got to share. She said, "We done good together." I miss her. We never met face-to-face, but a kindred cousin-bond it truly was.

I had found all of the 6 children & descendants. but one—**Helen**. I was able to connect with a gracious distant cousin in Marion Ward-Darrah of Seattle. Marion had the old Oakes Family Bible, that was carried through Caroline "Libbie" Oakes' brother. Perry Allen Oakes to the Salem, OR area. Caroline m. Wm. Cobley. Wm. & Libbie Oakes were Marion Adell Cobley's parents—and she (Marion) was my Grandfather's 1st wife.

Of the treasures Marion gave me were the original wedding invitations for Wm. H. Gear & Marion A. Cobley, the Oakes family Bible, and many exceptional family photographs.

My only sorrow is that Janet d. 3 wks. before I met **Marion Ward-Darragh**. Below you will see some of those treasures.

William Hathaway Gear's Life

Wm. H. Gear was b. 16 Sep 1876, in Chanute, Neosho Co., KS. He was the s/o John Clay Gear & Mary Jane Hathaway. John & Mary moved to Jo Daviess, IL by the time William turned 6. William falls from records until his Great Aunt Sophia [Gear] Farrar names him at age 9, as an heir in her will. Sophia d. in 1883 in Galena, Jo Daviess, IL. She lived

in the Galena Stockade with her husb. **Amos Farrar**, a fur trader.

By the 1900 U.S. census, **Wm. H. Gear**, his sister **Myrtha**, & brother **Clayton** are found living with their Grandparents [**Samuel West & Sophronia J.** (**Taylor**) **Hathaway**] in Guilford, Jo Daviess, IL. Wm. is 25 yrs. old at that time.

William met Marion A. Cobley in IL & they

were m. in Kendall Co., IL where they had their first 2 children, **Helen** & **Bruce Allen**, before moving to ND.

Both Helen (1903) & Bruce A. Gear (29 Apr 1904) were b. in IL. A 3rd child, Lydia Marion Gear was b. 19 Aug 1905 in ND. The family relocated to this area near Marion's Cobley family, who lived in Albion, MI. Evidence shows the Gear family moved from ND to Helper, Carbon, UT, where Lydia d. ae 4, of typhoid fever.

Early 1908, William had another daughter with Marion named Laura Iris Gear. Laura was b. 3 Feb 1908 in Helper, UT. In the 1910 census, Wil-

liam listed himself as a clerk in the R.R. Office at ae 27. His wife, Adell – ae 26, Helen - ae 7, Bruce – ae 6, & Laura – ae 2. Laura was followed by 2 younger sisters named Viola Rae Gear in Oct 1911 & Lillian Blanche Gear on 8 Dec 1912. Both these girls were also b. in Helper, UT. William & Marion Adell Gear had 6 children together — 5 girls & 1 son.

By 1916 however, this family seems to have crumbled. The Davis County Clipper newspaper (15 Sep 1916) reports **William** filed for bankruptcy. By June 1917 **Marion** had left Wm. and m. a **Hubbard Henderson**. **Hubbard** lists **Marion** & 3 girls as dependents in his WWI Draft registration. This new

family is found in Butte, Silver Bow, MT in the 1920 US census. **Marion & Hubbard** have a child together named **Maurice Henderson** who is given in adoption to a "Waggoner" family in TX (becomes renamed **Morris Waggoner**), and **Marion & Hubbard** either div. or separated. No records are yet found to follow these 3 people.

Little is known of **William** from 1916-20 when

he appears in records living with Olive Barlow Blood & her husband in Bountiful, UT ae 45. Olive is the younger sister of Hannah Lavon Barlow, Wm.'s future wife. Hannah lived with her parents Ianthus Haven Barlow, Jr. & Alice (Willey) Barlow.

Hannah Lavon Barlow & William Gear leave Bountiful, UT and m. in Moline, Rock Island, IL on 8 Apr 1921. On 7 Jan 1921, the couple's 1st child, Donald Barlow Gear was b. in Cedar Rapids, Linn, IA. Wm. was ae 46 and his young bride was 23 as they started their family together. William was listed in the Cedar Rapids city directory in IA in 1922. Mary Alice, Wm.'s 2nd child with Hannah Lavon was b. in Manchester, Delaware, IA on 9 Nov 1922. The IA State census in 1925 (Coggon, Linn Co.) has Wm., Hannah, and their 2 children listed.


Something changes in their life together in early 1925, and **Hannah** leaves **William** while pregnant with their 3rd child—**Haven Barlow Gear**, my father. **Hannah** moves back to Bountiful, UT and ultimately lives with her Aunt and Uncle on their farm in Pingree, ID. This is where **Haven** is born. **Haven Barlow Gear**'s birth certificate (20 Sep 1925) names **Wm. Hathaway Gear** as his father, who is listed as a farmer b. in IA.

William was not listed in Manchester, IA in the 1930 census. He would have been ca 50 y.o. There are no firm records found to trace Wm. after Hannah left. No confirming death records, or soc. security record, bur. or cem. info has been found as yet. However, Mary Alice, his dau., has a memory that he

was a "traveling salesman" and was passing through Pingree, ID when she was a young girl.

This is the last known fact about **Wm. H. Gear** after 1925. If anyone can help with more info on **Wm. Hathaway Gear** after 1925—please contact **Donna Gear Loper** at dloper3@comcast.net.




